Staff Development

Staff Development Day: Two staff development days were held this year.

Our first staff development day was held on 24th September 2018. The School's insurance consultant, Mr Gilbert Lee from Marsh (HK) Ltd conducted a seminar on the Professional Code of Conduct for Teachers. During the seminar, he discussed the laws governing conflicts of interest, crisis management, and the type and level of care for students.

The second staff development day was held on 8th March 2019. Our local teaching staff joined the Anglican (Hong Kong) Primary Schools Staff Development Day 2019, which

was conducted in Cantonese. Dr Charles Yu (余德淳博士) shared the *Inner Secret to being a Positive Teacher* and encouraged teachers to stay energetic and optimistic throughout their careers. Teachers from the English Department visited SSC on the same day with the aim to streamline pedagogical practices employed in teaching and learning English, Science and IT between the College and the Preparatory School. Our teachers observed a few classes and later attended a sharing session with teachers from the College. Teachers also took the opportunity to visit the newly built STEM room and learnt about the activities and projects that are conducted as a part of the STEM curriculum.

Professional Development

Expressive Arts Therapy Training for Teachers: A group of six teachers enrolled in the two-year Train-the-Trainer programme organised by the University of Hong Kong Centre on Behavioural Health. The programme commenced in July 2018 and the participating teachers have been receiving instruction on the concept of Expressive Arts Therapy and inquiring into the techniques that could be applied in a school setting to facilitate creative and therapeutic learning experiences for students. A follow-up workshop was held in May 2019, and the teachers had a fruitful day of interaction with educators from other schools.

Staff Welfare Committee

With a commitment to promoting staff welfare and maintaining a high staff morale, the committee organised a series of joy-filled events for both our teaching and non-teaching staff.

To encourage awareness of other's feelings and needs, our staff participated in a month-long activity, Secret Angels, where each staff member secretly carried out acts of kindness for an assigned colleague. Our staffrooms were filled with cheerful notes, little gifts, and countless random acts of kindness. The identities of the secret angels were revealed at our Christmas gathering which was a heart-warming event filled with laughter and gratitude.

Continuing in the spirit of team building, we hosted an outdoor Chinese New Year Turnip Cake gathering. Some of our staff members volunteered to bring in homemade turnip cakes and others helped to pan-fry the turnip cakes on the spot. Our Deputy Principal, Mr Gordon Wong, also prepared a series of handwritten Fai Chun, which were handed out by means of a lucky draw, symbolising good fortune and happiness.

To promote the physical health and fitness among our staff, a weekly Pilates Class was organised in the second semester. A group of teachers enjoyed relaxing pilates workouts on Friday afternoons, after school.

Revisions and Promotions

Revision of Salaries: In accordance with the all-graduate teaching force policy, the College Council reviewed and revised the salary scale of the local graduate teaching staff at the Preparatory School. After careful deliberation, it was decided that local teachers holding a Bachelors degree and who are professionally trained would be paid according to the Graduate Salary Scale instead of the Certificated Teacher Salary Scale.

Revision of Management Positions: It was also decided that the middle management positions, Assistant Master (AM) and Senior Assistant Master (SAM) would be merged and would now carry the title of Senior Master (SM).

Promotions: Mr Kelvin Lo was promoted to Deputy Principal. Mr Navin Tsui and Ms Katie Wong's positions were revised and they were promoted to Senior Master and Senior Mistress, respectively.

Farewell, Welcome and Births

Farewells: This year, we bade farewell to our longest serving staff member, Mr Eddy Kam. A beloved teacher and a respected colleague, Mr Kam was one of the most senior teachers in the school and served SSCPS for an impressive 45 years. Since joining SSCPS in 1973, Mr Kam had taught almost every subject in the school's curriculum except Music, Computer Education and Visual Arts. During his tenure he headed the Maths, Science and Health Education and Biblical Studies Departments. His various roles and responsibilities at SSCPS saw him overseeing multiple anniversary celebrations, launching many new programmes, and organising scores of events. He was well liked by his colleagues and students alike. To celebrate his long association with the school, a series of farewell events were organised by the Staff Welfare Committee, Parent-Teacher Association and Alumni. He will be missed dearly.

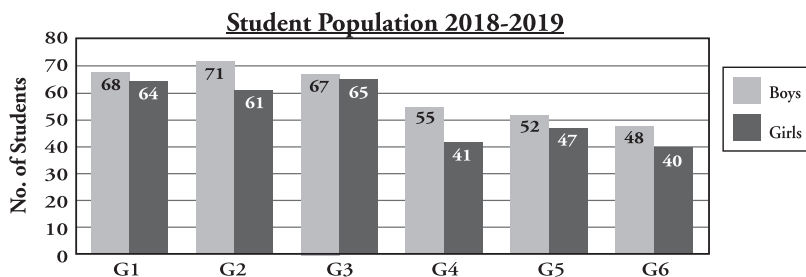

Boarders' Distribution 2018-2019

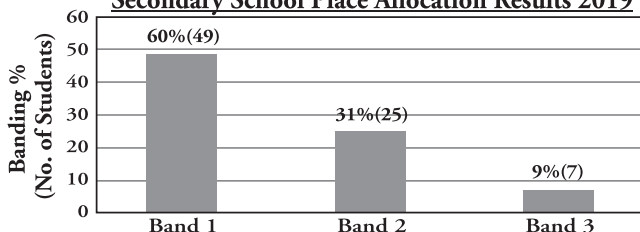

Battle of the Books 2019: This is the second year that we have competed in this book trivia battle and our team came second in the semifinal of the competition.

Talks and Visits

Theadora Whittington: To tie in with our Grade 1 Science unit on Animals, we invited Hong Kong-based author and illustrator, Ms Theadora Whittington to read from her two books, *The Sand Turtle* and *The Mermaid and the Pink Dolphin*. She also discussed the impact humans have on the environment and the importance of biodiversity.

Martha Keswick: Ms Keswick, the author of the popular bilingual Max and Mei picture book series, treated our Grade 4 students to a reading from her new, action-packed Pangu comic book series and shared her journey on becoming a children's book author.

SSC English Department Visit: A team of teachers from the College visited our school on 21st March 2019 in order to gain a better understanding of the method of teaching delivery at the Preparatory School. The main aim of the visit was to improve the vertical alignment of the English and Science curriculums between Grade 6 and Form 1 in order to facilitate a smooth transition for our students. College teachers observed some Grade 6 English lessons and attended a presentation delivered by the Head of English, Dr Rashmi Sahi.

CHINESE

This year, after a thorough review of the curriculum, many new elements were added to enhance the learning experience of our students. More picture books were incorporated into the curriculum and in Grade 1; each student was given a reading journal to allow them to record the books they had read and to encourage parents to read with them. In Grade 2, picture-based paragraph writing was introduced to facilitate the smooth transition from writing complex sentences to short paragraphs and students also participated in an exciting trivia competition about the Chinese language, organised by Campus TV. An in-house 'Chinese Battle of the Books' was organised for Grade 3 students to foster a stronger reading culture. In Grade 4 to Grade 6, elements of drama education and current affairs were added to the curriculum. Students took part in role-plays, case studies and small-group sharing activities that were both interactive and relevant to their daily life.

In addition, in order to maintain a close working relationship with the College and to better align our curriculum with theirs, our teachers paid a visit to the College and attended lesson observation sessions on 27th February 2019. Teachers of the College also visited the School on 21st March 2019 to do the same.

Alternative Chinese Programme 翱翔課程

The Alternative Chinese Programme 翱翔課程, was launched for Grade 4 and Grade 5 students in September 2015 and was expanded to Grade 6 in September 2016. This programme is a collaborative effort between the College and the Preparatory School. With the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in mind, it is designed to hone students' analytical and critical thinking skills. Students are expected to design their own research questions and engage in extensive reading of relevant books and articles. So far, the response from parents and students has been overwhelmingly positive. To cope with the increased demand, two classes of Grade 4 Alternative Chinese will be offered in 2019-20. A briefing session was held on 30th March 2019 to introduce the philosophy, content and requirements of the programme to parents. The list of students admitted to the programme was released in mid-June.

Activities, Talks and Visits

Besides classroom teaching, extra-curricular activities also play a very important role in piquing students' interest in learning Chinese and their understanding of Chinese culture. *Mid-Autumn Festival Riddle-Solving* and *Chinese Culture Day* were organised to enhance students' understanding of traditional Chinese Culture. Chinese literacy skills were consolidated and promoted through activities such as *Fun in Chinese*, *Idioms Galore*, *Chinese Battle of the Books* and our own publication of selected poems and prose by students, the *Yiqing Collection* (怡情集). As part of our post-exam activities The Constitutional and Mainland Affairs Bureau set up the *Getting to Know the Basic Law' Game Booth and Mobile Van*. A *Chinese Language Trivia Competition* was also hosted and several game stalls were put up to provide students with engaging learning experiences after the exams.

Excursions and talks were also organised to further enhance learning:

Dr Sun Yat-sen: Miss Janice Mak Kwan-yin, the Assistant Curator of the Dr Sun Yat-sen Museum, was invited to give a talk on 11th October 2018 to Grade 5 students on the relationship between Dr Sun and Hong Kong. A visit to Dr Sun Yat-sen Museum was arranged for students to learn about the life of Dr Sun and his close ties with Hong Kong.

Legislative Council Complex: In three groups, Grade 6 students visited the Legislative Council Complex on 18th October, 31st October and 15th November 2018 to learn about the history, functions and elections of the Legislative Council.

'All About Railways': Representatives from the MTR Corporation were invited to give a talk to Grade 3 students on 22nd October 2018 about the history and operation of the railways.

Shark Mystique 海洋公園鯊魚館: Grade 6 Alternative Chinese Programme students visited Shark Mystique at Ocean Park on 22nd October 2018 to enhance their understanding of the different shark species and conservation work.

Hong Kong Zoological and Botanical Gardens: Grade 1 students visited the gardens on 5th November 2018 to learn about plants and animals in Hong Kong.

‘Traversing the Forbidden City’: Actors and actresses of the Hong Kong Repertory Theatre were invited to give an interactive talk on the Forbidden City to Grade 4 to 5 students on 21st November 2018. Students not only watched a performance but also took part in it and interacted with the cast members.

Hong Kong Heritage Museum: Students of the Grade 4 Alternative Chinese Programme visited the Hong Kong Heritage Museum on 6th December 2018 to acquire a better understanding of Hong Kong’s history and culture.

The Blue House Cluster: Students of the Grade 6 Alternative Chinese Programme visited the Blue House Cluster on 7th January 2019 to learn about special architectural features in Hong Kong.

Hong Kong Museum of History: Grade 4 students visited the Museum on 13th February 2019 to learn about Hong Kong history and culture.

Kowloon Walled City Park: Students of the Grade 5 Alternative Chinese Programme visited the Kowloon Walled City Park on 14th February 2019 to acquaint themselves with the history and heritage of the Walled City.

Sky100 Academy: Grade 3 students visited the Sky100 Observation Deck on 28th February 2019 to enjoy a panoramic view of Hong Kong and appreciate the city’s transformation in the past decades.

Hong Kong Correctional Services Museum: Grade 5 visited the Hong Kong Correctional Services Museum on 5th March 2019 to learn about the work of the Correctional Services Department and the history and development of prisons.

Tai Kwun: Grade 2 classes visited Tai Kwun Centre for Heritage and Arts in April 2019 to learn about Hong Kong’s monuments and the local culture.

Mai Po Nature Reserve: Students of the Grade 4 Alternative Chinese Programme visited the Mai Po Nature Reserve on 9th May 2019 to get close to wild animals and appreciate the beauty of nature.

Ten Sights of Stanley: Students of the Grade 6 Alternative Chinese Programme visited the Ten Sights of Stanley on 22nd May 2019. Photographs taken were included in a compilation complete with captions, and an exhibition was held in the 6D classroom.

MATHEMATICS

This year, we renewed our focus on programmes that foster our students' number sense and analytical skills, while stimulating their interest in mathematics. iPads were also introduced as a learning tool. In order to promote productive and effective learning experiences for our students, our team selected topics, which were particularly suitable for tablet-based learning. iPad learning not only illustrates the learning concepts in vivid graphics but also allows learners to challenge themselves to think creatively and deepen their conceptual understanding. Talks and Visits

Talk on New 2018 Series Hong Kong Banknotes: Recognising Hong Kong coins and notes through observation is part of the Grade 2 mathematics syllabus. In order to arouse students' interest in learning about Hong Kong's currency notes, in April, we invited staff from the Hong Kong Monetary Authority (HKMA) to present a two-session seminar on the new 2018 series Hong Kong banknotes. Our students learned about the history and the reasons for issuing new banknotes. They had a chance to study the security features of the new banknotes through security features viewing devices. Some students were given a precious souvenir by the HKMA.

Visit to the Hong Kong Monetary Authority: In order to enable our students to gain a better understanding of Hong Kong's currency system, our Grade 2 students joined a guided tour to the Hong Kong Monetary Authority (HKMA). The visit was carried

out from February to April for the four classes. The HKMA staff demonstrated the security features of Hong Kong banknotes. Students learned that there were three banks in Hong Kong that issued currency. The exhibition displayed the Hong Kong Banknotes Series Spectrum of Life and fun facts about notes, which the students found really fascinating. The students were excited to find that shredded notes in plastic cubes formed a 'Money Tree'. The highly informative, interactive exhibition was fun for all.

Visit to the Supermarket: Grade 1 students visited Wellcome Supermarket in March 2019 with the aim to give students an opportunity to apply their knowledge of coin usage in an authentic situation. Each student brought along \$20 in coins, which they spent on two items of their choice. They kept the receipts and completed a worksheet after the activity.

SCIENCE, HEALTH EDUCATION AND STEM

The School attaches great importance to science, technology and innovation, and went to great lengths to provide a scientifically conducive environment, so that our students would acquire sound scientific skills. Throughout the year various excursions and activities were organised to extend and solidify their learning.

Talks and Visits

Joyful Fruit Months: Grade 1 to 3 students participated in the Joyful Fruit Months, an activity, organised in collaboration with Education Bureau to encourage students to eat more fruit.

Discovery Dome Mobile Planetarium: To provide students with an exceptional educational experience and to cultivate their curiosity, a state-of-the-art digital planetarium mobile class was arranged for all our students.

GEO's School Ambassador Programme: A geography exhibition was held in the School hall to acquaint students with slope safety, landslide prevention, and the geology of Hong Kong.

GEO's School Ambassador Programme Workshop: A highly successful workshop was held by Geo Technical Engineers for our Grade 5 students. Students were introduced to different methods and materials used for slope safety. The virtual reality experience about landslides stole the show.

Siu Ho Wan Sewage Treatment Visit: A visit to Siu Ho Wan Sewage Treatment Plant was arranged for our Grade 6 students to educate them about the role wastewater and storm water drainage services play in the sustainable development of Hong Kong. Students also visited The Solar Farm during this visit.

Robot Visit: An interactive session with different robots was arranged for our students with the aim to introduce them to artificial intelligence. Students were impressed by the robots' dancing, yoga and imitation skills.

UNICEF 'EatPlayLove@StanleyPlaza' Campaign: 26 Grade 2 students took part in UNICEF's *EatPlayLove* campaign to endorse the crucial principles of early childhood development: eat, play, love to parents and caregivers. Students enjoyed playing in the outdoor Imagination Playground and also took part in the maiden voyage of the Floating Classroom.

Science Museum Visits: All the grades visited the Science Museum. These visits were planned to enhance our students' interest in science, technology, and astronomy and also to encourage them to explore the wonders of science and the universe.

History Museum Visit: Grade 3 students visited the History Museum to learn about prehistoric animals and climate change.

Ma Heng Park: To understand the flora of Hong Kong and to consolidate their learning about plants, our Grade 5 students visited Ma Heng Park.

Paper Plane Competition: Organised in association with the PE Department, all our Grade 1 and 2 students took part in this exciting competition. Three winners were chosen from each class.

STEM Workshop at SSC: 25 Grade 5 students attended a STEM Workshop at the College, leading the way to greater coordination between the School and the College. The workshop was really popular with the students.

STEM Camp: In collaboration with HKPMA, a weeklong STEM Camp was arranged for Grade 2-4 students with two days of mandatory parental participation. Many STEM activities, including a QA session with NASA astronauts, were held.

MUSIC

Our policy ‘*One Child, One Instrument*’ was a proactive step taken in order to include the regenerative powers of music in our students’ life and the move has delivered its intended outcome. Our strong music culture has enabled the School to assemble a full orchestra and a symphonic band. We also have four choirs with members from every grade. Moreover, to expose our students to other musical traditions and cultures we arrange regular overseas tours and take part in different performances and competitions.

Performances

71st Hong Kong Schools Music Festival Prize-Winners’ Concert: As the winners of the *The Best Primary School Senior Choir in the Hong Kong Region and the Kowloon Region* and *The Best Primary School Intermediate Choir in the Hong Kong Region and the Kowloon Region* in the Choir Finals, our School Choir was invited by the Hong Kong Schools Music and Speech Association to perform in the Music Festival Prize-Winners’ Concert on 29th April 2019 at Tsuen Wan Town Hall Auditorium. The concert was recorded and broadcasted by Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK) Radio 4.

St Stephen’s College and Preparatory School Concert 2019: Our students performed in our annual school concert on 11th and 12th July 2019 at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University Jockey Club Auditorium. 60 Junior Choir members performed two pieces; *I’ve Lost my Homework!* and *I Give you a Song* in the concert on 11th July 2019. 98 Chevaliers members performed in the premiere of an original musical *The Oasis* in the concert on 12th July 2019. Furthermore, 100 Parent Choir members from SSC PTA, SSCPS PTA, Friends of SSCPS and two Principals along with soloist Ms Amy Mo performed *What a Wonderful World* in the concert on 11th July 2019.

Performance for 2019-2020 G1 Students: The potential Grade 1 parents and students were introduced to the School’s music and instrument programmes on 13th April 2019 at the School Hall through solo instrument demonstrations and performances by the School Orchestra.

Speech Day 2018: Our Senior Choir performed *HuXi* at the ceremony.

Master Classes

Choir Master Class by Professor Leon Shiu-wai Tong: Professor Tong, the former Head of the Music Department of our College, and the present President of the World Youth

and Children Choral Artists' Association and an internationally renowned choral conductor, speaker and adjudicator conducted the master class for our students on 18th February 2019. Our Senior Choir was given invaluable tips for better performances in their competition repertoire for the Hong Kong Schools Music Festival.

Orchestra Master Class by Professor Ragnar Rasmussen (Norway): Professor Rasmussen, a professor of conducting at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology and Arctic University of Norway advised our students on 20th February 2019 on ways to polish their competitive repertoire for the Hong Kong Schools Music Festival.

Competitions

71st Hong Kong Schools Music Festival: It was a Triple-Grand success for our Choirs at the prestigious 71st Hong Kong Schools Music Festival. Our choirs not only won the championship in all three categories (Senior, Intermediate and Junior), they also won two grand prizes in the Choir Finals.

Group Events: In the group events, our Senior Choir came first in Primary School Choir (Singing in Chinese) and was awarded *The Best Primary School Senior Choir in the Hong Kong Region and the Kowloon Region* in the Choir Finals. Our Intermediate Choir also came first in Intermediate Primary School Choir (Singing in Foreign Language) and was awarded *The Best Primary School Intermediate Choir in the Hong Kong Region and the Kowloon Region* in the Choir Finals. First place was also secured by our Junior Choir in Junior Primary School Choir (Singing in a Foreign Language).

SPORTS

Sport also helps students to develop self-discipline and leadership skills, build a sense of responsibility and teaches them to respect others.

Activities

Swimming Gala: The annual swimming gala was successfully held on 27th and 28th September 2018. Our team of hardworking janitor staff made sure that the pool was ready to be used post super-typhoon Mangkhut. A total of 378 students took part in a series of competitions. KOR Ka Hei (5C) of Tiger House and WONG Yik Yan Sean (6C) of Eagle House were declared the Individual Overall Champions. Tiger House was the Overall Champion and Dragon House won the cheering competition. We were honoured to have Kent Cheung Kin Tat who was awarded the Best Male University Athlete of Hong Kong by the University Sports Federation of Hong Kong as our guest of honour.

Sports Day: Our Sports Day was held on 8th January 2019 at Aberdeen Sports Ground. All our students participated in the Sports Day in one way or another. All the Grade 1 and 2 students were involved in the Mini-Olympics, which was a series of sports competitions. A number of exciting track and field competitions were held with the help of 28 parents volunteers. 184 parents took part in the parent-child games in which, VRIJMOED Justin (6B) of Tiger House was named the overall champion and also broke the Boys A 400m record. VISUAL ARTS

At SSCPS, our visual arts community is an extremely talented and prolific one. Students enthusiastically engage in artistic creation and extensive efforts are made by the VA department to further spark their creativity and imagination.

Visits

deTOUR - Trial and Error Design Festival: In December, the Grade 6 students visited this design industry event at the PMQ in Central. During the visit, students explored a number of installations and exhibitions that combined both creativity and design. Not only did they look at design projects created by professional designers, but also projects created by younger students. They delved deep into the idea development process of creation and also discussed components of good design.

Five-Artists: Sites Encounter Exhibition Tour at M+: As a post-exam activity in June, our Grade 4 students visited the exhibition *Five-Artists: Sites Encounter* at the M+ Pavilion in the West Kowloon Cultural District. The exhibition featured five female artists from around the world and showcased a wide array of artwork - including sculptures, installations, and films. Students were guided to appreciate the works in context and recognise the different media of expression. They also explored the site itself, getting to know more about this iconic clutter of museums that will represent Hong Kong in the international context in the near future.

Competition

Smart-age Workshop and Design Contest: Continuing in our quest for good design, our Grade 6 students joined the *Smart-age Design Contest*. The objective was to explore the daily life of senior citizens, and then propose new inventions that could assist them to maintain an active lifestyle. To start with, we invited a social worker who specialises in elderly social services, and a senior citizen to come to our school for a sharing session and a workshop. Through games, presentations and discussions, the students gained some first-hand information about what senior citizens need to maintain a healthy lifestyle. They then started to work on their designs in groups and used drawings to represent their inventions. Their designs not only attained a silver award and five merit awards, but they were also exhibited in the South Horizon MTR Station Art Gallery for a month in March. The students had an opportunity to advance their design skills and also practised their empathetic design thinking skills.

Project

One-Rock-One-Heart School-wide Fund raising Art Project: In June, as one of the post-exam activities, the visual arts department initiated a charity fund-raising art project, called *One-Rock-One-Heart*. As a school-wide project, each student was given a rock to paint, under the topic of *Great Things from Nature*. In alignment with our Ethics Education Programme, students were guided to brainstorm what nature has given us, and to show appreciation to Mother Nature through art. A total of HK\$7,791.60 was collected and net proceeds will be donated to Green Peace in support of environmental protection projects.

Parent Collaboration

Visual Arts Class with Parent Art Buddies: In November, parents of our first-graders were invited to become *Parent Art Buddies* and assist in art lessons with their children. The response from parents was very positive. With the help of our *Art Buddies*, we took

the students to the beach to have an outdoor drawing class. Students learned to do observational sketching and appreciate the beauty of natural resources, such as seashells and fallen leaves found on the beach.

Parent Art-Buddies - Painting a Rainbow Fish (Sharing is Caring): In March, the Grade Two *Parent Art Buddies* joined us for a thought-provoking art project. Our VA teacher first shared the picture book *The Rainbow Fish* a story about friendship and sharing with our students. Each student was guided to design and paint their own unique scales, which were later combined to build a big fish in a collaborative group painting activity.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

With the world today becoming increasingly technologically advanced, it is extremely important for our students to keep abreast of the latests technological developments. To do that, our students learn a variety of skills:

ScratchJr: Last year, our Grade 1 students were introduced to *ScratchJr*. This year, in Grade 2, they continued to study *ScratchJr* at a more advanced level. We hope to develop their critical thinking and problem-solving abilities, which are important lifelong learning skills.

Scratch: Students learnt advanced *Scratch* skills in Grade 4. Students developed their programming skills while learning about lists, defining procedures using webcam sensing, and debugging problematic code. They broadened their understanding of variables, operators, and event-driven programming while applying their existing knowledge in new ways of thinking about *Scratch*. *Advanced Scratch Programming* guides students through challenging concepts in *Scratch* programming. Building on their foundation of *Scratch* fundamentals, students are able to create intricate animations and games using complex logic and program design.

MS Kodu: *MS Kodu* is a new visual programming language compiled specifically for creating games. It allows students to create games on the PC or Xbox via a simple visual programming language. Our students learnt the process of game design and created interactive games.

micro:bit: Grade 6 students learnt about *micro:bit*, a 4cm x 5cm stripped down computer which is used to code and create anything and everything. Intended as a starter device to give students a basic introduction to physical computing and tinkering, it helped them move on to using more advanced devices such as an *Arduino*. Students also used *MakeCode* editor to program their *micro:bit* with blocks and *JavaScript*.

Talks

Be a Smart Netizen – Beware of Technology Crime: Grade 5 students attended this talk, conducted by the Hong Kong Police Force, in January 2019. Students learnt how criminals routinely and actively exploit our reliance on modern technology to commit technology crimes. Students were also made aware of the *Control of Obscene and Indecent Articles Ordinance*, which is aimed to protect people against objectionable web-based material.

RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Being a Christian school, we place a strong emphasis on Christian values, which are imparted to our students by means of regular formal classes and various activities that promote fellowship.

Prayer Room: Our school renovated and converted Block A's common room into a Prayer Room. The Prayer Room was designed with the help of Reverend Lam Chun Wai (林振偉牧師), Priest-in-charge of the Hong Kong Sheng Kung Hui St Peter's Church. After the renovation, teachers conducted prayer groups with the students in the morning before lessons, during recesses and after school.

Christmas Assembly: The annual Christmas assembly was held on 21st December 2018. Our students performed a contemporary Christmas play, which was both entertaining and meaningful. Pastor Kwok Kin Man from Kowloon City Baptist Church conducted a sermon after the show.

Gospel Meeting: On 25th June 2019, a crew of actors from *Showers of Blessing Evangelistic Ministry* (恩雨之聲) performed an interesting Gospel drama show for our Grade 2-5 students. After the show, the pastor explained the salvation of Jesus Christ in detail.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

At SSCPS, students have the opportunity to participate in a great variety of extra-curricular activities that range from music, sports, science, STEM, visual arts, academic clubs and personal development programmes. We believe that all these activities help our students to build skills, relationships, and a positive self-esteem.

Music: Music ECAs aim to enhance students' enjoyment and appreciation of music and help them to relax in the most constructive way.

Sports: With an expansive school campus and comprehensive sporting facilities, our students can enjoy a wide range of sports activities like football, basketball, volleyball, tennis, table-tennis, badminton, baseball, swimming, rope skipping, fencing and taekwondo.

Science and STEM Workshops: These workshops bring like-minded students together in a setting where science and STEM skills are developed in a positive social environment. This year, Grade 1-2 students took part in *STEM Odyssey* and Grade 1-6 students attended *Science Workshop*.

Visual Arts: These programmes are designed for students who wish to pursue satisfying individual interests growing out of various aspects of visual arts. *Active Art, Oil Painting Explorers, Comics Workshop, and Ceramics Workshop* were offered to the students this year.

Academic Clubs: These clubs help students to acquire skills in a non-pressured environment. The School offers Chinese language clubs, English language clubs, a Mathematics club, English debate, English and Putonghua choral speaking training, to name a few.

Cub Scouts: *Cub Scouts* is the only uniform team at SSCPS and it is designed to promote physical, mental and spiritual development among participants. This year, we had 15 new members joining us and we had 32 Cub Scouts in total. As in previous years, our cub scouts learnt various skills such as knotting, tracking and first-aid and were presented with member badges at a Promise Ceremony. They also participated in the annual Hong Kong Scout Rally at the Hong Kong Stadium.

JEMS Programme: This character building programme for Grades 1-2 focused on two main character subjects this year: Uniqueness and Friendship. In helping students understand their strengths and weaknesses and in guiding their understanding of the values that build virtuous friendships, this programme aimed to enhance the personal well-being of each student as well as their relationships so as to create a positive school environment.

Campus TV: Upon the completion of our Campus TV studio in 2018, an *All-Round MC and News Reporter Training Programme* was organised for student MCs and reporters. The programme focused on improving public presentation and interviewing skills.

IT: Various programmes were offered to enhance our students' understanding of the IT world. Students who participated in the *3D Anime Design Programme (Muvizu 3D)* learnt about the 3D animation process by using different themes, props and buildings to design scenes through shape editing and lens settings. Students also had the opportunity to create their own 2D games with *Construct 2.0* in the *Apps Design Programme*. The *MiP Robot Programme* allowed students to learn how to program the most challenging and interactive smart robots with the Coder *MiP* application.

PREFECT TRAINING

Joint School Leadership Training Camp: Our prefects were invited to join this three-day camp held at the YWCA Sydney Leong Holiday Camp from 4th to 6th January 2019. This camp was organised by HKUGA Primary School. Twelve SSPCS junior leaders participated in an unforgettable experience with junior leaders from HKUGA Primary School, Kau Yan School and Shap Pat Heung Rural Committee Kung Yik She Primary School.

Weekly Prefects' Meetings: To evaluate our prefects' performance and to support our school leaders, sharing sessions with prefects were conducted every Monday morning. Activities such as case studies and moral story telling were also conducted during these meetings.

BOARDING PROGRAMME

The mandatory Grade 6 Boarding Programme, which is our unique effort to help students become self-reliant in all aspects of their lives, has been running successfully for many years now. To ensure that students acquire all the skills needed to deal effectively with the challenges of everyday life, various additional programmes and activities further supported this initiative:

Personal Management Programme: Organised by Caritas Jockey Club Integrated Service for Young People in Stanley, this 10-lesson programme included both communication and collaborative skills training. The programmes focused on effective ways of communication and presentation, the enhancement of self-esteem, the development of self-understanding and problem-solving skills, the improvement of social skills, and the importance of volunteering in the community.

Life Skills Training: Resident tutors conducted life skills training to equip students with practical, social and interpersonal skills. This year, our boarders participated in various areas of skills training such as self-management, sewing, first aid, book wrapping, cookery, Chinese cultural and social skills, Western table etiquette, Chinese calligraphy and photography.

Social and Cultural Activities: Our boarders participated in various social and cultural activities which provided them with opportunities to appreciate cultural influences, demonstrate gratitude to their parents, collaborate with their peers, and contribute to the community:

- Adventure-based Training
- Parent-child Camping
- Cookery Competition
- Christmas Carolling at Pacific Place
- Parent-child Christmas Gathering
- Civic Education Resource Centre Visit
- Simulation Program on Ageing
- Savvy Planner Workshop by The Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups

Music Appreciation: Our boarders attended a concert called *Little Soldiers* featuring artists from The Hong Kong Society for the Deaf and The Hong Kong Blind Union at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre Concert Hall on 21st March 2019.

First Aid Course: Our boarders attended a 16-hour Basic First Aid Course organised by Hong Kong St John Ambulance. Boarders learnt about the appropriate treatment for various injuries, the correct way to apply dressings and bandages, and gained basic knowledge of the human respiratory system.

Healthy Helping Hands (心傳心): Healthy Helping Hands was jointly organised by St Stephen's College Preparatory School and H.K.S.K.H. St. Luke's Settlement Neighbourhood Elderly Centre. Students worked in groups and were accompanied by volunteers to make home visits to physically frail elderly persons. Students taught the elderly to do brain gym exercises, to learn the various functions of iPads, and to protect themselves from the cold. The visits helped the students to understand, care for and show respect to the elderly.

Food for Good (齊惜福): Our boarders visited the *Food for Good* community kitchen in Yau Tong on several occasions. Not only did they learn about the production of compost from food waste and how to use it for organic gardening, they also learnt about food processing. The visits helped the students to understand the importance of treasuring food resources and caring for people in need.

'Heart to Heart School' Recognition: Our school is now recognised as a *Heart to Heart School* since our students have participated in over 500 accumulated hours of voluntary service.

Language Programme: Every Tuesday night, our boarders engaged in fun, confidence-building English language activities. They wrote and performed dramas, tongue twisters and poetry, and even participated in an in-house choral speaking competition.

ETHICS EDUCATION PROGRAMME (EEP)

The theme of this school year was *Stay Humble, Be Courteous*. In line with this, we conducted the following activities:

Be an Angel for the Poor: To increase empathy and learn about poverty in Hong Kong, 15 selected Grade 4-5 students joined Be an Angel for the Poor Scheme (關懷貧窮小天使計劃), which was organised by the Mission to New Arrivals Limited (新福事工協會). The programme took place from January to April 2019 and students participated in two workshops that focused on the poverty situation in Hong Kong. They also visited and interviewed poverty-stricken elderly residents, and partook in the *To Be a Scavenger* outreach activity to experience the life of a homeless person.

Poor-Rich Lunch: To encourage our students to be more empathetic and generous to others, the School, in association with Oxfam, organised a Poor-Rich Lunch on 4th March 2019. On that day, Grade 5 and 6 students and teachers received either a lavish or a very simple lunch, in order to experience the inequity faced by millions in this world today. During the meal, teachers shared the reality of the inequality of the food situation in our world today. Students were also encouraged to share their feelings and views in this regard. Finally, students completed a reflection worksheet to suggest ways to alleviate poverty and reduce this disparity. We also managed to raise \$25,700 for Oxfam Hong Kong.

Lost and Found: Over the years, the number of lost items accumulated at the canteen has become a concern. This year, the school tried various methods to reduce the number of lost items. Prefects were assigned to check the name labels on school uniforms and water

bottles. All lost items were centralised in the canteen, so that students knew where to look for them if they had been misplaced. A competition was organised where a goldfish logo was placed on each unclaimed item. The class with the most goldfish was given a duty to perform. Since the inception of the competition, the number of unclaimed items has reduced significantly.

TALKS AND ACTIVITIES

Talk on Puberty for Girls: This talk, hosted by *Procter and Gamble* on 19th March 2019, aimed at acquainting Grade 5-6 girls with the physical and psychological changes experienced during puberty and teaching them how best to respond to these changes.

Be a Teacher a Day (Students): After the success of *Be a Teacher a Day*, a student version was held to give students a taste of teaching as well as giving teachers an introduction to coding. A session on *ScratchJr* was held in June. Four Grade 2 students showed the teachers how they created short animation films and games with their coding knowledge and skills. The teachers then had an opportunity to create their own game with the assistance of the student-teachers. Teachers enjoyed the session and had a more concrete idea what coding meant, while the students experienced some of the issues teachers faced in class.

Spring Social: A fundraising event for the School's Ethics Education and Life Education Fund was held in March 2019 at Tang Shiu Kin Sport Field. A Parent-Child Hat Design Competition and a lot of other fun activities were arranged, including a *Fun with Science* workshop; a Christian booth called *So So Club* run by parent volunteers; face painting; charity sale of shoes, tea, wine, organic plants and various other goods donated by parents. A parent-child football match and other booth games were also organised. During the event, five families were selected for the outstanding hat design award and received special souvenirs. A total sum of about \$220,000 was raised.

SSCPS has got Talent 2019: We held our third annual talent show to showcase the enormous wealth of talent our students possess. More than 300 students auditioned for the show and over 70 awe-inspiring acts ranging from singing, dancing, magic performances, comedy sketches and musical recitals, were selected to perform in the show. It was a resounding success!

Energy Efficiency Scheme Outreach Programme: On 30th January 2019, our Grade 4 students visited a mobile classroom to learn about the importance of energy saving. This program was organised by the *Electrical and Mechanical Service Department*.

Health Talk: The Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health conducted a talk on the hazards of smoking and secondhand smoke for our Grade 5-6 students on 15th January 2019.

A Mass Variety Show 'My Dream' 《我的夢》: 35 prefects were invited to watch a show called *My Dream* on 4th April 2019 at the Hong Kong Cultural Centre to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China and the 100th anniversary of 4th May Movement.

PICNICS, CAMPS and OVERSEAS TRIPS

Each year, a number of outdoor and overseas excursions are organised so that our students can experience new environments and thereby extend their learning and growth opportunities. This year, our students visited the following places:

Education Camp: Our Grade 4 and 5 students attended a three-day camp from 28th-30th November 2018 at Po Leung Kuk Pak Tam Chung Holiday Camp and The HKFYG Jockey Club Sai Kung Outdoor Training Camp respectively. Students enjoyed the outdoors while learning the importance of teamwork and discipline in achieving goals.

Graduation Camp: The annual Graduation Camp for Grade 6 took place at B.G.C.A. Bradbury Camp from 15th-17th May 2019. The focus of the camp was to help students get ready for a smooth transition to secondary school and to give them an opportunity to share their memories of primary school life. Students participated in a three-day adventure-based training programme, which included a rope course, balance walking and solo night walking.

Parent-Child Taiwan Education Tour 2019: This much-in-demand tour co-organised by the HKPMA World Vision Academy was conducted in two phases in April over the Easter holidays. The theme of the tour was *Using Our Five Senses to Develop Empathy and Encouragement* (由五感出發—同理·同行) with the aim to encourage students to come out of their comfort zones and cultivate a sense of empathy, encouragement and social responsibility, while experiencing the Taiwanese culture and lifestyle through activities and workshops. The participants visited the Taiwan Forest Primary School and participated in the *City Hunt Activity* in Taipei. They also attended a sharing session by Taiwan's Helen Keller, Ms Fu-hua Chuang, and her mother, and took part in the Dialogue in the Dark workshop.

Cultural Overseas Education Tour (Grade 6): This year, our Grade 6 students went on a four-day trip to Nagoya, Japan from 27th April 2019 to 30th April 2019 to mark their graduation. Students visited popular attractions like the Nagoya Castle Hommaru Palace, the Port of Nagoya Public Aquarium, Legoland and many other interesting places.

LIBRARY

Our library is dedicated to encouraging a lifelong love of reading. During recesses and after school, the library is abuzz with budding and seasoned readers and enquirers. This year we had 23,153 books in our library and an additional 3,080 books were purchased. Here is a data snapshot of books borrowed throughout the year:

Continuous efforts are made to sustain our students' interest in visiting the library and to this end new books and editions are continuously added. This year's reading theme was *Learn from Others to Reach New Heights* and books related to this theme were displayed prominently. Students also participated in various activities to promote reading. Grade 1-2 students took part in the *Happy Reading Companion* activity organised by the Hong Kong Central Library. Grade 3 students visited the Hong Kong Central Library and participated in the Chinese Battle of the Books (「三年級中文閱讀大挑戰」). A book fair was also organised in the covered playground on Parent-Teacher Day.

Classroom Libraries: In addition to the main school library, classroom libraries were set up for all grades at the beginning of the year. 80 carefully selected English and Chinese picture, chapter and nonfiction books were placed in each class.

Birthday and Graduation Book Clubs: To celebrate our students' love of books and to supplement our school library, a Birthday Book Club and a Graduation Book Club were launched last year. Parents were encouraged to celebrate their children's birthdays and graduation by making a monetary donation to the library for the purchase of new books.

In September 2018, the library had received HK\$133,100 in donations from 344 students. All Grade 6 students were also invited to join the Graduation Book Club and celebrate their graduation in a meaningful way by donating \$200 to the library. By June 2019, the library had received HK\$7,300 in donations from 31 graduating students.

Parent Volunteers: Parent volunteers are an integral part of our school life and their important contributions are highly valued. This year we invited a host of volunteers to fill various roles, the most important being at our ever-expanding library. Our 22-member strong team of long-serving library volunteers helped with wrapping new books, entering data in the library system, shelving returned books, repairing damaged books and helping with events at the library.

STUDENT HEALTH AND WELFARE

The School is dedicated to our students' health and well-being and we are committed to incorporate positive, proactive and preventative health education, counselling and services to provide a safe and healthy school environment.

Seasonal Influenza Vaccination: We participated in the *Vaccination Pilot Programme* offered by the Department of Health. All students were invited to receive an inactivated quadrivalent seasonal influenza vaccine for free. The first dose was administered on 24th October 2018 (Wednesday) for all participating students from Grade 1-6. The second dose was administered on 10th December 2018 (Monday) for those participating students under 9 who had never received a seasonal influenza vaccination before. A total of 394 students received the vaccination. Here follows a table of the number of participating students from each grade:

Our School has also successfully applied for the 2019/20 Seasonal Influenza Vaccination (SIV) School Outreach (Free of Charge) Programme for the upcoming academic year.

Life Education and Counselling Services: The School is committed to provide a safe and secure learning atmosphere conducive for our all our students to develop positively and we are proactive in providing professional help if needed. This year, the school counselling team helped 97 students with academic, emotional, social, and/or behavioural needs.

Welfare Activities for Students and Parents

Reading and Writing Training Programme: This programme is aimed at providing useful reading, writing and studying skills for students who have dyslexia or dysgraphia.

Rising Star Student Ambassador Programme: This programme consisted of interactive activities which were designed to enable students to understand the dangers of drugs and to teach them how to healthily and effectively cope with pressures and challenges in life.

Sleep and Behaviour Treatment Programme: Some students with ADHD and their parents were invited to participate in this programme, which was co-organised by HKU and CUHK. It aimed to address the important correlation between sleep and impulsive behaviour in those diagnosed with ADHD.

Sherlock Holmes Professional Seminar: Hosted by the Post-Traumatic Counselling Association, various preventative methods were introduced to help students in crisis return to normal school life.

VISITORS FROM OVERSEAS

Every year, teachers and students from other schools and neighbouring countries visit our campus. This year was no exception.

Visiting Teachers: From 4th to 15th March 2019, two teachers visited the school and observed Science and Health Education and Maths classes.

Visiting Students: On 2nd May 2019, a group of 30 students and two teachers from Hangzhou Caihe School visited the School as part of an exchange programme. The visiting students attended some classes with our students. Later, our students performed a few songs for our guests and they reciprocated with a showcase of Chinese dance and martial arts.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

The Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) organised and arranged a variety of activities over the year:

Parents' Lunch: An introductory and social luncheon for Grade 1 to Grade 6 parents was held on 19th September 2018. 222 parents joined the lunch, the highest number of attendants to date. Class Representatives were announced during the lunch gathering.

Hug Hug Teachers' Day: This year *Hug Hug Teachers' Day* was held in October 2018. There was 'Hug Hug' time on the playground where students showed their appreciation and gratitude by giving their teachers a big hug and presenting them with roses.

Parent-Child Community Service: The PTA continued their commitment to the elderly and visited YWCA Ming Yue District Elderly Community Centre on 11th November 2018.

Family Fun Day: The annual Family Fun Day was held on 9th December 2018 on the School football pitch. The theme of the day was STEM, which was in alignment with a series of STEM educational activities at school. Participants were encouraged to bring their own utensils and water bottles to promote a clean and green environment. It was a great success with record numbers achieved in all aspects, including both the number of tickets sold (2,354 tickets and over HK\$159,000 in ticket income) and the number of participants (1,752 participants). Cash and gift sponsorships from more than 80 families helped raise around HK\$330,000 for the event and the total net income of more than HK\$420,000 was transferred to the Charity and Education Development Fund. The day was a huge success!

Gifts Transfer Programme: This year, over 200 gift items were collected from across all grades after Chinese New Year in early February 2019. The items were donated to the People's Food Bank of St. James' Settlement.

Parents' Seminars: Two seminars were successfully held for SSCPS parents. On 28th March 2019, Mr. Rex Wu, Director of HealthyMind Parents Academy conducted the first seminar on the topic *Positive Parenting at Home*, which was attended by 74 parents. The second seminar was conducted by Dr Allan Yuen, Associate Professor in Information and Technology Studies at the University of Hong Kong, on the topic *Nurturing the Digital Generation* on 23rd May 2019.

Joint Schools Event – Tea gathering for SSC Parents and SSCPS Grade 5 and 6 Parents: The two-hour tea gathering was held on 8th April 2019 at the *Frites Belgium on Tap* restaurant in Central. It was organised with the aim to help Grade 5 and 6 parents to get an insight from existing SSC parents. The event received a positive response and 76 parents of both SSCPS and SSC were in attendance. The Principal of SSC, Ms Carol Yang and SSCPS' Deputy Principal, Mr Gordon Wong answered questions posed by the parents on the day.

Joint Schools Event – Celebration of SSC and SSCPS Music and Sports Achievements:

The PTA co-organised the *One Student One Ice-cream* event on 23rd May 2019 for all students, teachers and supporting staff in collaboration with SSC PTA, Friends of SSCPS and Alumni Association to celebrate the school's music and sports achievements.

Students' Seminar: A local not-for-profit organisation, EcoDrive Hong Kong screened their award-winning documentary film *A Plastic Ocean* about Hong Kong's plastic problem to Grade 3, 4 and 5 students on 24th June 2019. Ms Sherry Fung Wong, co-founder of the organisation explained the documentary and facilitated discussions about the film.

Souvenirs to PTA Members: As a token of appreciation for joining the PTA, a set of stainless steel straws were given to each of the member students in June of this year. Teachers received power bank chargers as gifts, which were presented to the teacher representatives at the year-end assembly on 27th June 2019.

Newsletter: Two issues of the PTA newsletter were published in November 2018 and June 2019. Besides reporting on PTA and school events (including overseas tours), teachers, parents and students were invited to write for the newsletter on a particular subject or share their experiences at the PTA and school activities. The newsletter also reported on students' achievements in various external competitions.

Graduation Yearbook: This was the eighth year that the PTA coordinated the production of the graduation yearbook for Grade 6, which records precious moments and happy memories of their school as well as boarding lives at SSCPS.

e-Time Capsule: As in previous years, a working committee for the e-Time Capsule project among Grade 6 parents was formed. Besides that, parent representatives of students who graduated between 2012 and 2018 liaised to arrange the first 10-year graduation gathering, which will be held in 2021.

SSC and SSCPS Music Concert: Following the great success of Parents' Choir performance at the School's 80th Anniversary Concert last year, a joint performance by the SSCPTA and Friends of SSCPS was held at the Music Concert on 11th July 2019.

Charity and Education Development Fund: This year, HK\$485,578 was raised on the Family Fun Day and during the YWCA Elderly Home Visit Community Service and was transferred to the Charity and Education Development Fund. From this fund, donations and contributions were made as follows:

- School facilities and children development programmes (HK\$300,000)
- School English Debate Competition (HK\$1,000)
- SSC & SSCPS Music Concert (HK\$ 15,000)
- YWCA (HK\$28,900)
- Raffle tickets for charities (HK\$ 2,000)

MAINTENANCE AND INSTALLATIONS

Some essential maintenance work was carried out on campus this year. Repair work to some of the staff quarters and some of the buildings was carried out. Washing machines and the wire mesh at the football field were replaced. In addition to this, the old library was converted into a STEM Laboratory for the newly launched STEM programme. A new room for the newly appointed deputy principal was also constructed.

CONCLUSION

The expansion programme of the school continues both at a structural and strategic level. The School will continue to explore and implement programmes to help our students to become responsible global citizens. With so much emphasis and awareness in the world on globalisation, we plan to engage our students in meaningful dialogue through our teaching and our EEP programme. We are committed to making the world a better place for future generations.
