REGULAR PASISIMPLE

 We use the past simple for actions that happened at a definite time in the past.

E.g. I played basketball yesterday. He walked to school earlier.

• The past simple can be formed by adding -ed to the end of the verb:

E.a. walk – walk**ed**

jump – jump**ed**

• Some spelling rules to form the past tense:

i) If the verb ends in **-e**, then **-d** is added to the end of the verb:

E.g. like – like**d**

agree - agreed

ii) If the verb ends in a vowel and a consonant, the consonant is usually **doubled** before **-ed**:

E.g. stop-stop**ped**

plan – plan**ned**

iii) If the verb ends in a consonant and **-y**, you take off the y and add **-ied.**

E.g. try-tried

carry – carr**ied**

iv) But if the word ends in a vowel and a -y, you add -ed.
