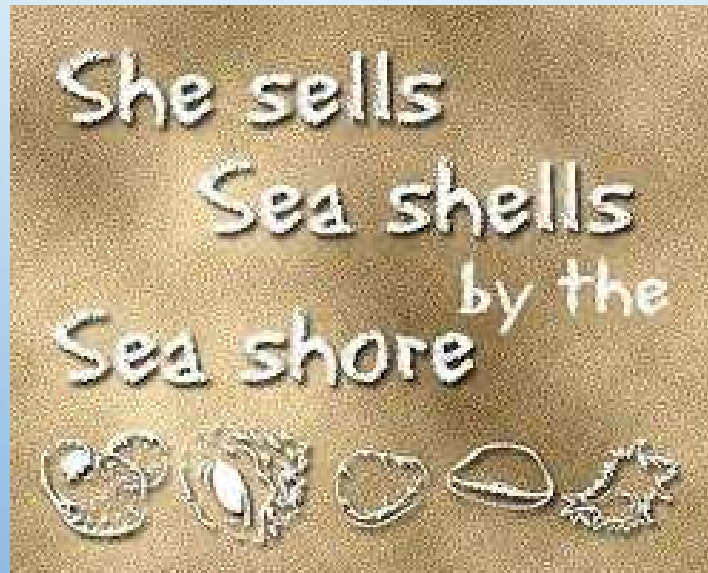

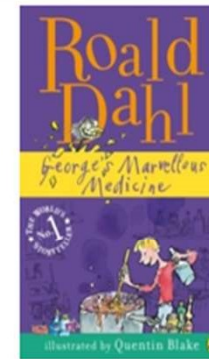

2. What did George use to stir the marvellous mixture?

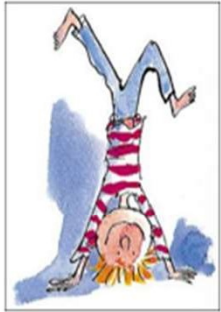
George used a wooden spoon to stir the marvellous mixture.

WHAT IS ALLITERATION?



ALLITERATION

Repetition of the first sound or sounds in a group of words.

(EX: Sally sells seashells.)

SOME RULES:

1) The beginning letters do not have to be the same as long as they sound the same:

Example: George and John joined a gym.

No: George went to the game.

2) Can be two or more words close together in the same sentence.

Example: John likes to joke.

No: John played a game and told a funny joke.

3) Small words don't really count.

No: Alex was a nice person.

No: He took the hat off of the hook.

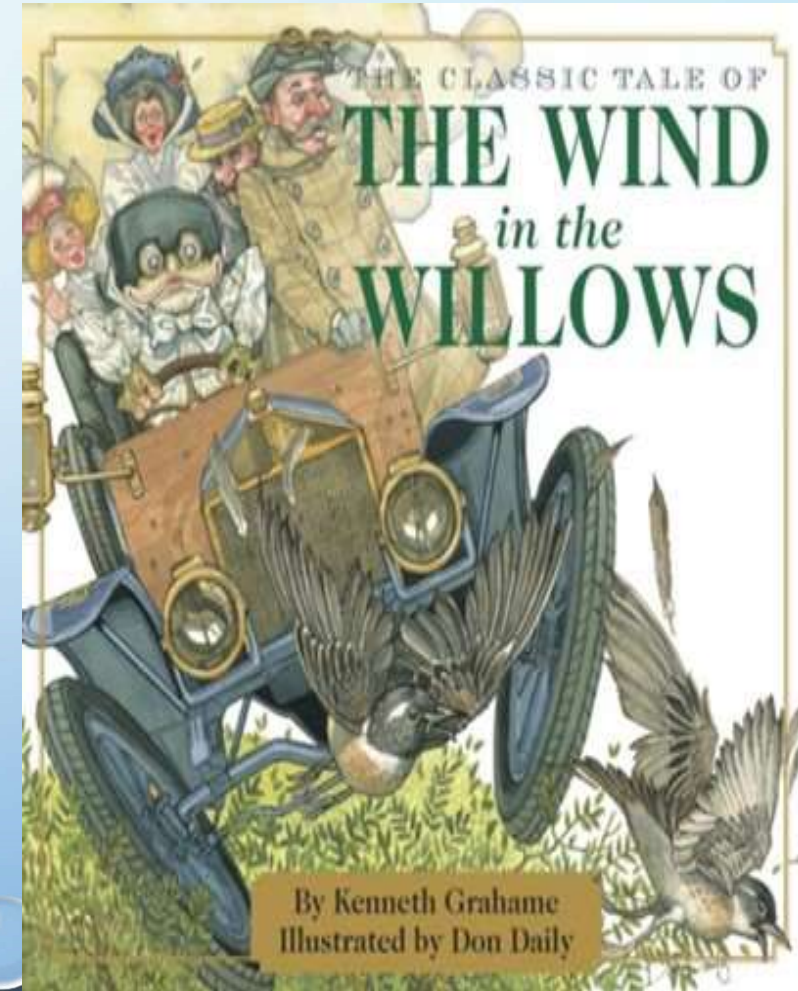
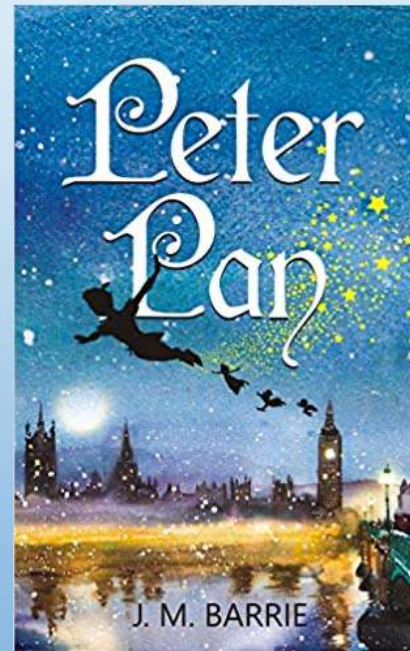
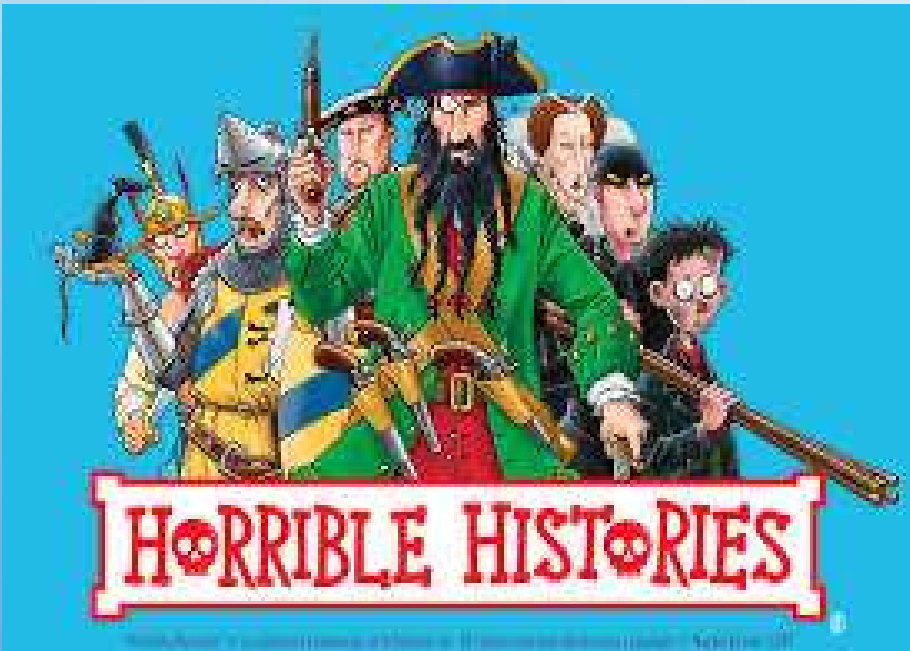

MORE ALLITERATION IN GMM

Many of the ingredients he puts in his medicine have alliteration as their name!

Examples:

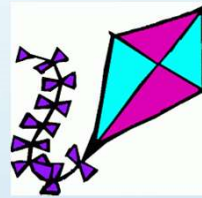

Tomorrow I will take a train to town.



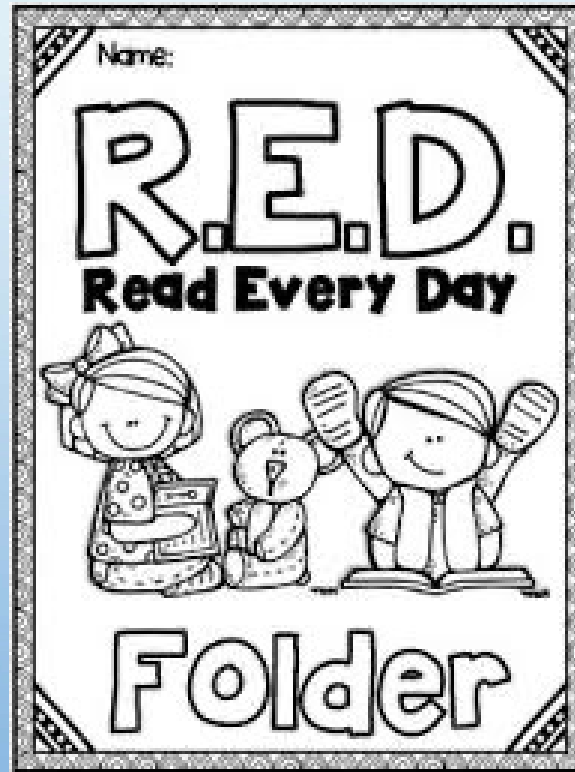
Everyone enjoys eating ice cream.
